Building His Church— The Konoinia (Κοινωνία) Wall: Part 1

1 Corinthians 12:27

Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it.

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TODAY'S FOCUS PASSAGES

Acts 2:42-47 (NIV)

They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to **fellowship** (**Koinonia**), to the breaking of bread and to prayer. ⁴³ Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles. ⁴⁴ All the believers were together and had everything in common. ⁴⁵ They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need. ⁴⁶ Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, ⁴⁷ praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved.

Acts 4:32-37 (NASB)

And the congregation of those who believed were of one heart and soul; and not one of them claimed that anything belonging to him was his own, but all things were common property to them. ³³ And with great power the apostles were giving testimony to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and abundant grace was upon them all. ³⁴ For there was not a needy person among them, for all who were owners of land or houses would sell them and bring the proceeds of the sales ³⁵ and lay them at the apostles' feet, and they would be distributed to each to the extent that any had need. ³⁶ Now Joseph, a Levite of Cyprian birth, who was also called Barnabas by the apostles (which translated means Son of Encouragement), ³⁷ owned a tract of land. So he sold it, and brought the money and laid it at the apostles' feet.

- 5. Why do you think we (the Christian community as a whole) often struggle with having this kind of depth in relationships today? What are some of the things that hinder us? (10 minutes)
- 6. What aspect of life in the early church do you most desire for yourself? For your family? For this group? For our church? (10 minutes)
- 7. How could you help your family and church develop a stronger Koinonia? (5 minutes)

- Using a Bible concordance or internet search, find the places in the New Testament that use the word "fellowship" (Koinonia).
- Spend some time examining the context of each of these instances and what they say to our building the Koinonia Wall.
