Digging Deeper

(for group study and conversation, and for personal reflection)

Today we reviewed the life experiences of Paul as related to the "Great Commission" wall as we are Building His Church.

Step 1: Review of Acts 21-23: Divide up into smaller groups of 2-3 people each. Assign the following passages for each group to review and to discuss the questions below. Then regather to report what you have learned. *(35 minutes)*

- Paul at the Temple (Acts 21:26-36)
- Paul as an Aramaic-speaking Jew (Acts 21:40 22:21)
- Paul as a Roman citizen (Acts 22:22-29)
- Paul as a Pharisee in front of the Jewish Sanhedrin (Acts 22:30 23:11)

Answer the following questions as they relate to each part of the story:

- Who was Paul speaking to in this situation?
- How did Paul's life experience open doors and gain access to a specific people group in this situation?
- How did God use this circumstance to tell the story of Jesus?

Step 2: Review the "personal application" portion of the sermon today. Discuss how this **can be** and **has been** true in your life's journey. How have you seen God use your life for his glory? (25 minutes)
