## 2 Corinthians 5:16-21

Having been reconciled to God through Christ, we receive a ministry of reconciliation which we carry to the world as Christ's ambassadors.

## MEMORY VERSE: 2 Corinthians 5:20

Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, certain that God is appealing through us. We plead on Christ's behalf, "Be reconciled to God."

- 1. What is RECONCILIATION?
