DIGGING DEEPER Small group study and discussion

Read the story in Exodus 3:13-22 as a group, and answer these questions from the passage:

- Who is God as we discover him in this story?
- What do you see as significant about the God of the Generations—the God of all the Ages?
- What is significant here? What are some personal implications and applications for you about the God of the generations as revealed here?

Take some time as a group to apply what we learned during the teaching time (see the highlighted points on the other side of these notes). Walk through some or all of the following scripture passages and discuss what we learn about God in each.

- Isaiah 14:26-27
