Theologian Len Sweet said, "Missions is not an activity of the church, but an attribute of God. God is a missionary God, Jesus is a missionary Messiah, and the Spirit is a missionary Spirit. Missions is the family business."

- In what way is God a missionary God?
- How does Jesus show himself to be a missionary Messiah?
- How is the Spirit a missionary Spirit?
- Do you feel personally engaged in the "family business" of missions?
- What are some practical ways you or your group can engage?
