MEMORY VERSE

QUESTIONS FOR KIDS



- 1. What did God tell his people to use as a sacrifice for the Passover?
- 2. What were the Israelites supposed to put around their doors?
- 3. What did God want his people to remember?
- 4. How does this sacrifice remind you of Jesus? How does Jesus's sacrifice allow God to pass over our sin?
- 5. What do you do to remember Jesus' sacrifice for you?

QUESTIONS FOR YOUTH



- 1. Why did God harden Pharaoh's heart? (11:9)
- 2. What did the blood of the lamb on the doorposts represent?
- 3. Why did God command his people to remember the Passover? What were they supposed to remember?
- 4. <u>Challenge</u>: We are not just supposed to remember what God has done for the sake of remembering. It is supposed to impact how we live our lives today. This week, set a reminder somewhere you'll see, like your phone, a sticky note on your bathroom mirror, or a notecard on your nightstand. The reminder can be something like Galatians 2:20, or that we are no longer slaves to sin, but free in Christ.

QUESTIONS FOR ADULTS

- 1. How exactly were the Israelites "purchased" through the tenth plague?
- 2. In your own words, explain the significant connection between the Passover Lamb and the Christ.
- 3. The Jews were instructed to observe the Passover for generations to come (see Exodus 12:42). How are you and I to also "observe" the Passover, as if we also were there to experience the Exodus ourselves?
